Organizations & Regional Programs

<u>Appalachian Landscape Conservation Cooperative</u> – large collaborative research and management partnership working to protect land and biodiversity in the region.

<u>Appalachian Mountains Joint Venture</u> – collaborative partnership to restore forest habitat in the Appalachian Mountains.

<u>Amphibian and Reptile Conservancy</u> – promotes the conservation of amphibians, reptiles, and their habitats in the United States.

<u>Blue Ridge Forever</u> – collective effort to conserve land and water resources in western North Carolina.

<u>Conservation Fisheries</u> – works to preserve aquatic biodiversity in the southeast US through restoration of native fish populations.

<u>Conserving Carolina</u> – promotes protection and stewardship of land and water resources in western North Carolina and northern South Carolina.

<u>EcoForesters</u> – forestry organization providing services and educational opportunities for landowners focused on conservation and restoration in the Appalachian region.

<u>Aquatic Conservation Research Lab - Appalachian State University</u> – research lab focused on how stream biota responds to changes in habitat conditions.

<u>Conservation Management Institute – Virginia Tech</u> – works with natural resource agencies and other partners to help answer management questions.

<u>Highlands Biological Station – Western Carolina University</u> – offers research and educational opportunities.

<u>Fernow Experimental Forest – USFS Northern Research Station</u> – located in West Virginia, contributed to BMP design for forest management, and currently contribute to research on issues related to biodiversity.



<u>River Basin Center – Odum School of Ecology at University of Georgia</u> – works to connect science to aquatic management and policy, emphasis on the southeast US. Project – Forestry BMPs and At-Risk Aquatic Species in the Southeast

<u>Southern Appalachian Biodiversity and Ecology Center – Western Carolina University</u> – promotes collaboration in research, education and outreach focused on biodiversity in the region.
